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# **General Household Survey 2006**

The General Household Survey 2006 data is in four files. The files are flat, ASCII, fixed field files, with one line of given length per record. This format was chosen so as to make the data usable with as many statistical programs as possible, and thus accessible to as wide a range of people as possible.

Users can also access, explore and download the microdata in various formats, i.e. SAS, SPSS, Stata, etc. as well as the metadata from StatsOnline at <a href="https://www.statssa.gov.za">www.statssa.gov.za</a>. Click on 'Interactive'.

# THE DATA FILES

The files and the corresponding sections of the questionnaire are as follows:

**PERSON**: Data from Flap and Section 1

WORKER: Data from Section 2
TOURISM: Data from Section 3
HOUSE: Data from Section 4

The files also contain some derived variables.

The information in each file contains the following:

- Nature of records in the file and population covered
- Description of variables

# **Description of variables**

The description of the variables comprises the following information:

Descriptive name: This is a short English description plus the variable name in the original file used by Stats SA to construct the ASCII file.

**Position of the variable:** The position of the data within the record, recorded in the format (@xxx y.). "@xxx" indicates that the data begins at position (i.e. column) xxx and "y." indicates that it is y digits wide. All data is numeric. All data is right justified.

**Source:** This is either the question in the questionnaire or, for derived variables, the method of derivation. Derived variables are usually found towards the end of a record.

Valid range: The range of valid values for the variable. For continuous variables this reflects the upper and lower limits as found in the data.

**Not applicable:** The code for not applicable is provided for each variable. These are now numeric.

Missing value: A code for "missing"/unspecified values is given for each variable.

Notes: Specific observations to be noted by users.

Most questions in the General Household Survey questionnaire are pre-coded, i.e. there is a set number of choices from which one or more must be selected. For open-ended 'write-in' questions, the description will note that post-coding occurred and explain how this was done. Most variables have been pre-coded from the questionnaire and are not repeated

in the variable description. Where the coding is not apparent, the description either provides the codes or indicates where code lists are to be found.

# Linking files

The data from different files can be linked on the basis of a record identifier. The record identifier is the first field/s in each file. Each record contains a number (UqNr), which constitutes a unique household identifier. All records with a given household identifier, no matter which file they are in, belong to the same household. For individuals, a further two digits constitute the Person number (PersonNr). When these are added to the household identifier, a unique individual identifier is created. Again, these can be used to link records from the PERSON and WORKER files. The syntax needed to merge information from different files will differ according to the statistical package used.

# **METHODOLOGY**

# Sample design

Enumeration Areas (EAs) that had a household count of less than twenty-five were omitted from the census frame that was used to draw the sample of PSUs for the Master Sample. Other omissions from the frame included all institution EAs except workers' hostels, convents and monasteries. EAs in the census database that were found to have less than sixty dwelling units during listing were pooled.

The Master Sample is a multi-stage stratified sample. The overall sample size of PSUs was 3 000. The explicit strata were the 53 district councils. The 3 000 PSUs were allocated to these strata using the power allocation method. The PSUs were then sampled using probability proportional to size principles. The measure of size used was the number of households in a PSU as counted in the census.

The sampled PSUs were listed with the dwelling unit as the listing unit. From these listings systematic samples of dwelling units per PSU were drawn. These samples of dwelling units form clusters. The size of the clusters differs depending on the specific survey requirements. The GHS uses one of the clusters that contain ten dwelling units.

# Weighting the GHS of July 2006

A two-stage weighting procedure was done on the GHS 2006. The PSU inclusion probability is given by

$$P_{PSU} = \frac{n_{PSU}}{N_{PSU}}.n_{S},$$

where  $n_{PSU}$  is the number of households constituting the selected PSU during census fieldwork,  $n_S$  is the number of PSUs per stratum, and  $N_{PSU}$  is the number of households constituting the selected stratum during census fieldwork. The household inclusion probability per PSU is given by

$$P_{HH} = \frac{n_{HH}}{H_{HH}},$$

where  $n_{HH}$  is the number of selected dwelling units per PSU,  $H_{HH}$  is the number of dwelling units in the PSU in question at a particular time different from the census time.

The household weight adjusted for non-response is given by  $\frac{1}{P_{HH} r_{HH}}$ 

where  $r_{HH}$  is the response rate and is given by  $r_{HH} = \frac{n_{RESP}}{n_T}$  where  $n_{RESP}$  is the number of responding households and  $n_T$ 

is the total number of visited households per PSU. The adjusted sample weights are now given by

$$W_{HH} = \frac{1}{P_{PSU}.P_{HH}.r_{HH}}$$

A SAS macro called CALMAR was used to benchmark  $W_{HH}$  to the mid-year estimates. The mid-year estimates were adjusted to give population estimates for July 2006 (when survey fieldwork took place).

# Coverage

The target population is private households in all nine provinces of South Africa and residents in workers' hostels. The survey does not cover other collective living quarters such as students' hostels, old age homes, hospitals, prisons and military barracks.

# **DEFINITIONS OF TERMS**

# The population of working age – people aged 15–65 years.

Not economically active population includes people who are not available for work, such as full-time scholars and students, full-time homemakers, those who are retired and those who are unable or unwilling to work.

Economically active population includes people aged 15-65 who are employed and those not employed.

# Official and expanded definition of unemployment

Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) uses the following definition of unemployment as its official definition. The *unemployed* are those people within the economically active population who: (a) did not work during the seven days prior to the interview, (b) want to work and are available to start work within two weeks of the interview, and (c) have taken active steps to look for work or start some form of self-employment in the four weeks prior to the interview. The expanded definition of unemployment excludes criterion (c).

Workers include the self-employed, employers and employees.

Formal dwellings include a house on a separate stand, a flat or apartment in a block of flats, a townhouse, a room in a backyard, and a room or flatlet on a shared property.

Informal dwellings include shacks or shanties in informal settlements or in backyards.

*Piped water in dwelling or on site* refers to piped water inside the household's own dwelling or in their yard. It excludes water from a neighbour's tap or a public tap that is not on site.

Clean water refers to piped water (regardless of from where) and water from a water carrier/tanker.

Electricity for cooking, heating and/or lighting refers to electricity from the public supplier.

Hygienic toilet facility refers to a flush toilet, chemical toilet or pit latrine with a ventilation pipe.


